

MUSIC BOOSTER MINUTES

Meeting called to order by Traci Nelson at 7:00 PM

Secretary Minutes: Approved. Motion to accept Dena Salloum, 2nd Jim Bailey

Treasurer's Report: Current balance \$71,062.14, payment sent to Tri-M music society annual renewal fee has not cleared yet, once payment clears balance will be \$70,962.14

Band Report:

Mr. Porter reported final games will likely be 10/19/2018 and 10/26/2018, unless the football team wins both games and makes playoffs.

Final competition will likely be 10/20/2018 at Thomas Worthington at 8:15 PM. If the band makes state competition, the contest would either be 10/27/2018 or 11/3/2018 in Brunswick, or 11/4/2018 in Dayton. The band improved since the competition at Pickerington 9/22/2018, but the students themselves felt they didn't do well enough at the Teays Valley competition 10/6/2018.

He also reported there is sheet music in the hall for concert auditions and jazz band auditions will be held soon.

Choir Report:

Ms. Huston reported the choir is getting ready for a program for Veterans' Day; she asked for volunteers for the performance and about 100 students volunteered.

The OCC Honor Choir is the 1st weekend of November.

She also reported that fitting are underway for performance attire and she could really use help with sewing during 1st period.

Expenditures/Reimbursements: Traci Nelson wants to check into purchasing Quick Books online, Jim Bailey suggested adding it as a line item annual expense.

Old Business: There were 24 mattresses sold at the mattress sale fundraiser, earning \$2,420.00.

The Buffalo Wild Wings fundraiser will continue until 11/4/2018.

The Labor Day flea market earned \$850.00, and the Lions Club broke this up into 2 checks for \$500.00 and \$350.00. One of these checks pays the student volunteers, and Mr. Porter will return it to the Lions Club to request cash to give to these students. Each student will receive \$25.00, and the music boosters will receive the remaining \$50.00.

New Business:

There will be a fundraiser at PJ's restaurant on 11/12/2018, the time should be from 5:30 to 9:30 PM.

Mr. Porter received approval in the September meeting to purchase 2 new podiums, and when one of the old broken ones was being hauled away, the owner of Jet's Pizza stated he would like to help with the purchase of the new ones; he gave the boosters \$695.00 to pay in full for one of the new podiums. A thank you card will be sent to him.

Other Business:

Dena Salloum and Heather Cox are working on information booklets and are putting together 2 different ones: 1 will be targeted more to new band students (freshman and transfer students) as a "Band 101" booklet, where the other will be aimed more for the parents. Some of the items they are including in the booklets are about volunteering, snack schedules, drumline/pit, buses, fittings, food for band camp, and chaperones. Ideas also mentioned were to work on lineup before season starts and getting student volunteers to go to the middle school to teach basic marching to 8th grade band students.

The president position is still open. Jim Bailey feels that the 2nd vice president and 2nd trustee positions should go to middle school parents in order to "groom" them.

The NYC trip payments are due 10/19/2018, 11/16/2018, and 12/18/2018. The trip itinerary is being rearranges - events are the same, just dates and times may change.

Jim Bailey would like to give a gift card to Joey Hubbard for all he does to help with the pit crew, etc. He motioned to donate \$25.00 to purchase the gift card, 2nd by John Grossenbacher.
